



Winter 2018 and summer 2019 Expression of Interest responses

WPD launched 18 new zones on the 18 of June and asked for Expressions of Interest for service provision. The data provided was used to determine the potential flexibility within the zones and assess their high level viability. Following this assessment 16 of the zones are being taken forward.

In total over 261MW of capacity responded across 87 sites. These enquiries were then classified into 4 categories: Fully compliant, Potential, Non-compliant and Out of Zone. The volumes in each category are highlighted in the table below.









The split between Generation, Demand reduction and Storage is highlighted in the table below. Whilst most of the MWs are provided by generation, most of the sites are made up of demand reduction. This is explained by several larger generation sites.








The distribution of sites across the CMZs was assessed with the following zones taken forward.
